



A REGION, NOT

Myoko is much more than a single destination. While most of the ski resorts are located around the base of local namesake Mt. Myoko, the choices extend across the valley to the east and Tangram Ski Circus and Madarao Kogen Ski areas, south to the family-friendly Kurohime Kogen Ski Area, and north to Lotte Arai Ski Area. You'll find everything from immaculately groomed slopes, to ungroomed, steep powder and bump runs, to the longest continuous run in Japan (8.5 kilometers non-stop, if your legs can handle it).

JUST A RESORT

Because of the transportation corridor in the valley, getting around is fast and convenient, even during the often extremely heavy snow. Trains move like clockwork to Nagano and on to Tokyo, as well as to Joetsu City and the ocean, and from there on along the Sea of Japan to Kanazawa—and even to Osaka and Kyoto. And to lots of other destinations in the area and across the country.

So Myoko isn't just a resort: it's a whole region of places to choose from, and of things to do!

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
